III. Presentation by Department of Public Health on Promoting housing security and healthy homes for families served by Public Health. (presentation item)

[Commissioners provided with the following: Report by Karen Cohen]

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Karen Cohn, MS, CIH, SFDPH Children's Environmental Health for Promotion Program provided a PowerPoint presentation on Promoting housing security and healthy homes for families served by Public Health.

- Families with children are consistently the majority of SF overcrowded homes. Only 30% of SF 3+ bedroom units are occupied by families with children (<18 y.o.)</li>
- In the five years from 2011-2015, 53% of all affordable housing built in SF, or 280 units, were family sized, with two or more bedrooms.
- Where SF falls short in producing new housing for families, more families are living in overcrowded conditions, and an increasing number in SROs.
- In 2014, 699 SF families with children were living in single rooms within Single Resident Occupancy (SRO) hotels, where the average room size is 8 ft. by 10 ft.
- This is a 55% increase from the 2001 count.
